Personnel expected to operate in CBRN contaminated environments, “Must have” appropriate training and equipment, to meet safety requirements.









Cold Zone – Incident Support



Generic Model Cordon Control Areas







Forensic Considerations

- *All samples/evidence removed from scene must receive preliminary analysis*
 - Must identify radiological or explosive material prior to transport to a laboratory
 - Based on the identified hazards is the material safe to:
 - Transport?
 - Submit to the laboratory?

- Leak proof containers.
